Thesis – Intervention Evaluation of Mental Preparation2000 - 2004Strategies for the 200 meter run: a Controlled Outcome Study

This quantitative study evaluated the influence of several mental preparation strategies on 200 meter run performance. Participants were randomly assigned to one of 3 conditions: 1) technical skills and motivational statements, 2) negative statements, and 3) a control group. Results revealed no significant differences among these conditions.
